

**CITY COUNCIL MEETING
RAND CENTER
June 19, 2018
6:00 P.M.**

Mayor Pro-Tem Struble presided over the meeting and called it to order at 6:00 P.M. with the following Council members present: Gunderson, Pfouts, Stueve. Council member Tiffey was absent. Also present were: Vonda Ford, Caleb Wohlers, Melba Struble, Leonard Ratliff, Barbara Guinan, Rita Smith, Misty Graeve, Jeff Frey, David Johnson, Georgia Johnson, Jesusa Christians, Bruce Kocher, Eric Wulf.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Struble asked Council for any comments or additions- Gunderson, Pfouts, and Stueve requested and will be 19a, 19b, and 19c. Struble also advised item #17 Discussion and possible action on the score board at the old football field, will be removed.

Motion by Pfouts, seconded by Stueve to approve the agenda with the deletion of item #17 for the June 19, 2018 meeting. Motion carried on a 4-0 vote.

Motion by Gunderson, seconded by Pfouts to approve the following items on the consent agenda: a) June 5, 2018 and June 6, 2018 minutes b) claims list c) Water and Park Board reports d) Clerk's Financial Report e) liquor license for Loess Moose Bar & Grill

Rita Smith thanked Council for the repairing of alley off 9th ST. It was done very nicely although the rain has caused problems. Requested street department to check on it for necessary repairs due to rain.

Barbara Guinan requested more diligence on getting the City cleaned up. Burnt out buildings, unpainted building make things look terrible. Suggestions to look into grants or other means to help with improvements.

Jeff Fry from Olmsted and Perry was present. 5th Street is mostly complete. Recent rains have caused a need for regrading and reseeding. Hope to be able to schedule final walk through next week. 4th and Michigan is done and a lot better. There are some areas north that is washing out and needs attention by the street department. Jeff also made a suggestion to revisit the intersections on 5th Street for the possibility of additional stop and yield signs. Olmsted and Perry have prepared a contract for removal of dirt from City property based on findings from Harrison County. Contract has been signed.

Motion by Gunderson, seconded by Stueve to approve payment to Sherman Company LLC in the amount of \$19,296.00. Motion carried on a 4-0 vote.

Motion by Pfouts, seconded by Stueve to approve request by Walter Mason to close N 5th Street, Linn Street to Elm Street for tree removal contingent on Mr. Mason contacting City Clerk with actual dates of closure. Motion carried on a 4-0 vote.

Motion by Pfouts, seconded by Stueve to approve the Swim Team to have a car wash fund raiser at the Aquatic Center. Motion carried on a 4-0 vote.

Eric Wulf, a representative with Thrasher presented proposal for fixing the settling issue at the Library. Thrasher would use a pier system to stabilize foundation. This would be warrantied for 25 years and includes foam stabilization after building is leveled. The total cost would be \$96,553.44.

Motion by Stueve, seconded by Pfouts to approve Jim Long to the vacant position on the Park Board. Motion carried on a 4-0 vote.

Motion by Pfouts, seconded by Stueve to table purchase of tow-behind sprayer for the Parks Department until additional information can be obtained from Parks Department. Motion carried on a 4-0 vote.

Motion by Stueve, seconded by Pfouts to approve Resolution Approving the Transfer of Funds from Emergency Fund to General Fund. Motion carried on a 4-0 vote.

Motion by Pfouts, seconded by Stueve to approve Resolution Setting Wages for City Employees for Fiscal Year 2018. Motion carried on a 4-0 vote.

Motion by Gunderson, seconded by Stueve to waive 3rd reading for Ordinance #540, Amending Subsection 69.08 of Chapter 69 of the Code of Ordinances for the City of Missouri Valley, Iowa, Concerning No Parking Zones. Motion carried on a 4-0 vote. Motion by Gunderson, seconded by Stueve that Ordinance #540 is adopted. Motion carried on a 4-0 vote.

Motion by Stueve, seconded by Pfouts to authorize City Clerk to pay bills thru June 30, 2018. Motion carried on a 4-0 vote.

Council member Gunderson advised several pot holes on Willow Creek Bridge on Hwy 30. This will be referred to the Street department for contacting the State.

Council member Pfouts would like to express appreciation to the pool staff for handling a situation. Also, would like to see an Ordinance put in place to protect the face of primary hill. Requests to be on July 3, 2018 agenda.

Council member Stueve would like to express appreciation to the lifeguards for doing a good job.

Motion by Pfouts, seconded by Stueve to adjourn at 7:33. Motion carried on a 4-0 vote.
